

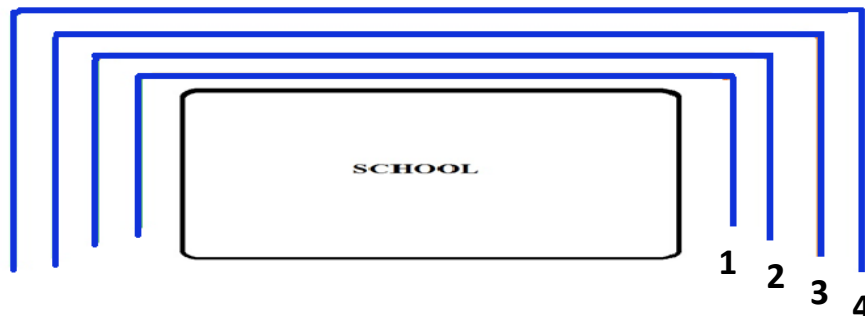

## Guide Lines For Dismissal



The car-rider line is one of our largest synchronized events of the day. We need your help to keep it flowing!

Please pay attention to the car-rider escorts. Because we value the safety of our students and staff, **PLEASE DO NOT use your cell phones, smoke, exit your vehicles, or talk to parents in other vehicles.**

**Placards must be in pick-up vehicle and visible on the driver's side at all times, NO EXCEPTIONS!** This applies to **anyone** picking up your child. Only the primary parent will be allowed to purchase a placard. If you do not have a placard, you must present your ID in the front office.

**SPEED LIMIT IN CAR RIDER LANES IS 5 MPH FOR YOUR SAFETY,  
AND FOR THE SAFETY OF OTHERS, PLEASE DO NOT SWITCH LANES!  
STUDENTS ARE ONLY ALLOWED TO EXIT ON THE PASSENGER SIDE OF THE VEHICLE.  
WHEN YOU ARE STOPPED, YOU MUST PUT YOUR CAR IN PARK.**

### Placard – K - 8:

All four lanes will be open during dismissal. All grades may use any of the four lanes.

### Exit Procedure:

Upon exiting the parking lot, **LANES 1 & 2 MUST TURN LEFT** and **LANES 3 & 4 MUST TURN RIGHT.**

**ALL DISMISSAL LANES CLOSE AT 3:25 p.m.** After 3:25 p.m., please park in visitor's parking, and go to the **FRONT OFFICE** with placard in hand. Please pick up all aftercare students from the cafeteria doors. Thank you for your assistance as we have diligently worked to improve our dismissal procedure. **All students remaining after 3:30 p.m. will be charged \$15.00 per child.**

### Important Information:

Please extend courtesy to local businesses and avoid blocking their parking lot entrances. Also, please be aware that we receive UPS/FedEx deliveries during dismissal time and allow them ample space to turn into our parking lot. Finally, and most importantly, we ask for extreme caution while driving through the neighborhood. We have children walking to and from school and want to protect them while being good neighbors.
